

Nature of the criminal activities or corrupt conduct against which the authorised operation was directed	Trafficking in a controlled drug other than cannabis, contrary to section 603(7) of the <i>Criminal Code 2002</i> (ACT), punishable by imprisonment for 10 years, 1,000 penalty units, or both. This is a relevant offence for the purpose of the <i>Crimes (Controlled Operations) Act 2008</i> in that it is an offence against an ACT law punishable by imprisonment of three years or more.
